CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE DICK FRENZ

Since 1940 we have had one mission: to deliver festive food hampers to the least fortunate of our community. This year we celebrate our 70th Anniversary as one of Edmonton's longest serving successful charities. The tradition of sharing continues and on your behalf:

We will work with over 1000 volunteers, from the Board of Directors to the file clerk in the office, each of them offering their time and expertise.

We will treat each applicant with dignity as we approve them for the festive food hamper.

We will serve impoverished families, seniors living alone and singles in need.

We will deliver our service most effectively and efficiently.

We will work with over 60 organizations and agencies to reduce the duplication of service thus ensuring that donor dollars reach the greatest number of eligible families, seniors and singles.

At the end of our 70th campaign year we anticipate over 70,000 less fortunate Edmontonians will have qualified for assistance. Many of them will call or send notes thanking the donors for a Christmas with hope; a Christmas with dignity.

This year it will take over \$1.8 million to pay the grocery bill and deliver our program.

If you are looking for a miracle this Christmas, there is one happening in your own community.

As volunteers, you play a major role in helping the Christmas Bureau reach our campaign goals.

In this our 70th Anniversary Year, the Christmas Bureau of Edmonton anticipates that we will serve 70,000 less fortunate within our community. Traditionally 70% of our festive food hampers are delivered to improverished families; with 30% delivered to seniors living alone and individuals in need. In order to pay the grocery bill and deliver our program, the goal for this years fundraising campaign is \$1.8 million.

The tradition of sharing continues. Non-denominational and accessible to all, the Christmas Bureau works closely with a number of other organizations to ensure that the money we raise is used effectively without duplication of service. While the process of determining a person's eligibility is a thorough one, it is marked by a spirit of compassion and generosity, respecting his or her dignity, integrity, confidentiality and rights.
