Make a Donation: making a monetary donation to the Christmas Bureau is an easy and effective way to ensure you're helping Edmonton families in need.

Monthly Giving: donating to the Christmas Bureau monthly by setting up a monthly donation of your choosing can lessen the financial impact of making a single, large, donation. Donating only \$10/month (less than one cup of coffee per week), will sponsor a family of 8 this Christmas! To set up your monthly donation, visit our website.

Hamper sponsors are responsible for the purchase and delivery of the festive hamper—all hamper sponsors will be provided with a recommended grocery list based on the size of family you'll be sponsoring. This is a very popular program with offices, families, and social groups.

Since 1940, the Christmas Bureau's mandate has remained the same—to provide a festive meal and co-ordination of Christmas giving to Edmontonians in need. The Christmas Bureau is a community effort to serve the less fortunate in Edmonton at Christmastime.

The Christmas Bureau provides Edmontonians in need with a single application process to receive a festive food hamper or food gift card, toys for children age 0 to 12 years from 630 CHED Santas Anonymous, and a teen gift card for youth age 13 to 17 years from the Adopt-A-Teen Program. For many of our clients, the stresses of being able to provide a festive celebration are lessened by the gift they receive from the Christmas Bureau. For our clients the opportunity to share the simplest of traditions—sharing a meal—is made possible through the Christmas Bureau.
