You know them, but not what they are going through.





A total of 55,450 people received the services of the Christmas Bureau in 2017. 48% of those were children and teens who would have also received assistance through 630 CHED Santas Anonymous and our Adopt-A-Teen program.

HOW WE COLLABORATE WITH COMMUNITY PARTNERS

Great things can happen when we work together!

The Christmas Bureau works with many social services agencies in Edmonton who help screen and qualify families in need and who refer their clients to the Christmas Bureau. Together, we have a stronger network to deliver our services.

We are proud to partner with Junior Chamber International, the Salvation Army, Sacred Heart Church of the First People, Beulah Alliance Church and St Vincent dePaul Church. These agencies also provide festive meals to people in need—we work together to ensure that our services are not being duplicated. By working together, we can reach even more people in need. In 2017, these agencies served 1,526 families in Edmonton.

We make applying for Christmas services easy for families in need. A family simply completes one application—we take care of the food and teen gift cards and 630 CHED Santas Anonymous takes care of the toys for children 12 and under. Three charity programs working together for Edmonton families.
